Dr. Evelyn Maria Dean-Olmsted is an assistant professor in the Dept of Sociology and Anthropology at the University of Puerto Rico, Rio Peidras. As a linguistic anthropologist, she studies language, power, and social identity in Latin America. She will present her ethnographic work on language and identity among Syrio-Lebanese Jews in Mexico City. She analyzes how speakers creatively and pragmatically draw on semiotic resources to forge relations in seemingly disparate social fields and challenge stereotype and stigma.
